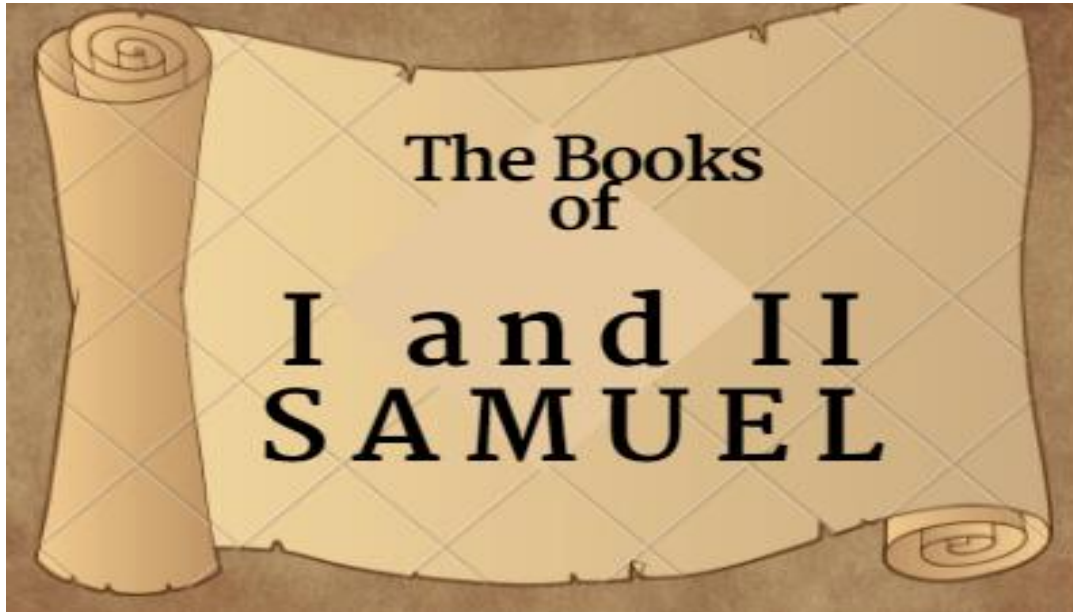

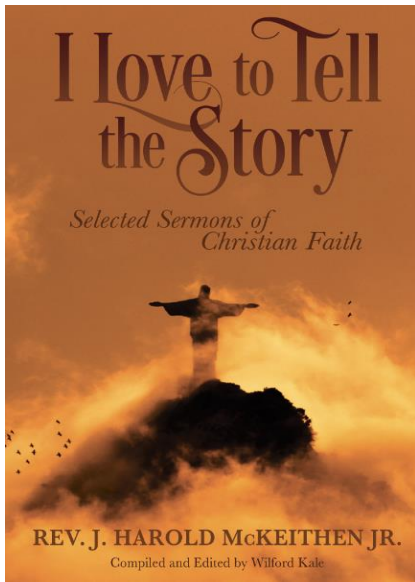

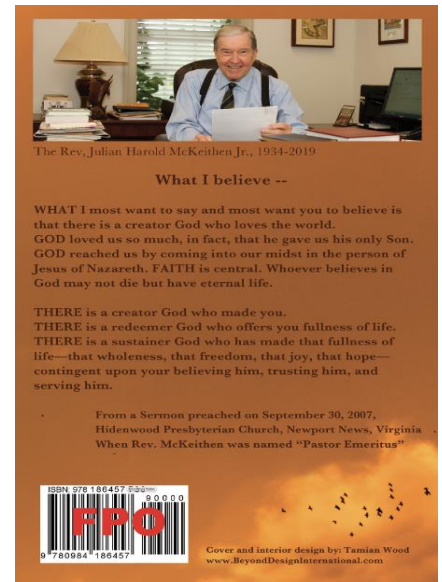

## Stanly Community Christian Ministry

First Presbyterian Church has had a special connection with SCCM over the many years. Our church family has generously responded to the needs of our community through the various opportunities that SCCM provides. The Mission Committee would like to highlight these for you.

- **Each year a designated amount of money for SCCM is included in the church mission budget.**
- **Faith on the Fifth Offering** – on the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of a summer month and of a winter month a special offering is taken to help SCCM clients with cooling and heating expenses.
- **10-Cents-a-Meal Offering** – a percentage of this offering goes to SCCM to support the meal programs.
- **Circle the Sanctuary** – in July needed food items are brought in to place around the perimeter of the sanctuary which are then taken to SCCM's food pantry.
- **Gardening for SCCM** – in the past members would bring produce to share within the church family for a donation. Extra produce and the donation monies are taken to the assistance center.
- **Alternative Gifts** – at Christmas time members have the opportunity to make a donation to SCCM in honor or in memory of a loved one.
- **Caring and Sharing Cups** – during the month of October members have the opportunity to fill these cups with money. This money is used for direct client expenses and to purchase food.
- **Community Table** – twice a year our church provides a nutritious meal on a Saturday.
- **Clothing Closet** – many of our members donate clothing and household items which are sold at affordable prices. People in need of clothing are able to shop the Clothing Closet twice a year free of charge. Sixty percent of the money raised through the Clothing Closet supports the overall operation of SCCM.

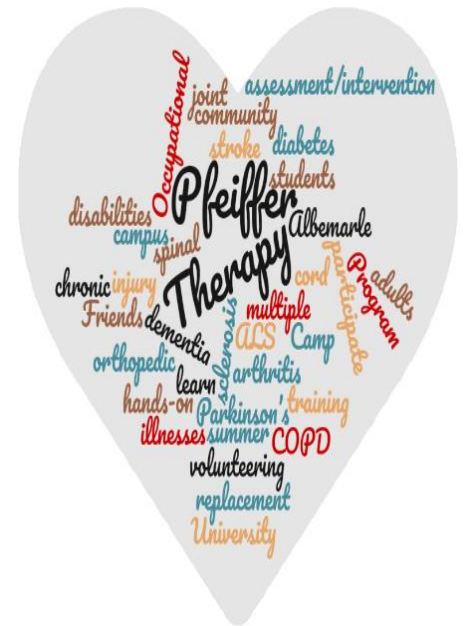
A primary goal of the Occupational Therapy Program at Pfeiffer University's Albemarle campus is to provide our students with hands-on training in the assessment/intervention for adults with disabilities.

These disabilities may include chronic illnesses such as COPD, diabetes, and orthopedic conditions including joint replacement and arthritis. We also work with adults with dementia, stroke, Parkinson's, multiple sclerosis, ALS, spinal cord injury, and other neurological conditions.

We are asking for community volunteers to participate in a *Therapy Camp* this summer. The camp will be held at the Center for Health Sciences Campus in Albemarle July 12-19, 2021 from 9:00 a.m. – Noon.

During that time, our students will learn from you about your chronic condition, how you manage yourself, and they will have an opportunity for that hands-on practice they need before going on their 12- week clinical fieldworks in 2022.
