From Where I Sit from Cathy

Dear Friends,

October 1 is my one-year anniversary as your Transitional Pastor. I always appreciate a good milestone so Happy Anniversary! As I look back on the year, first, I can't believe it's been a year. Second, I can't believe it's been a year full of learning and growing and challenge and some more learning...laughter, tears, a wee bit of frustration (mine? yours? God's?) much joy and then some more learning. I think of my first Sunday worship with you; my first-ever Kirkin' of the Tartans and trying hard not to weep from the pulpit at the beauty and majesty of that time of worship; I think of my terror at having to use my code to get in the building the first time (after weeks of making sure I wasn't the first one in); learning (and sometimes forgetting your names....and thank you for being so patient!); I think of joyful fun visits and visits that were hard and sad; I think especially of your deep love for our Lord and for each other, your energy in caring for needs in the world and community. I think of your great care of me during my mom's illness and the time after her death...this congregation will always be special to me for that.

It's no surprise that I'm not perfect...either as a woman, a mom, gran, or pastor. But here's the good news, this is not a perfect church...there is no such thing. We're all just doing our best to get through this life the best way we know how. For people of faith, we believe that best way to be in the fellowship and in communion with folks who remind us who we are (God's beloved children) and what we're created and called to do (glorify God and care for all of God's children). Sometimes, we get it right. Sometimes, we get it wrong. Sometimes, we manage to come close...grateful to God and each other for the grace.

At its stated meeting, the Session and I renewed our contract which means I will continue to serve with you until your next installed pastor is called. The Session has also called for a meeting of the congregation for October 16 at the close of worship for the purpose of acting on a recommendation from the Nominating Committee and the election of the Pastor Nominating Committee. Let me say many thanks to Ellen Whitley, Bill Jolly, Kim Marshall, Catherine Moeller, and Sandy Rogers for their diligent work on the Mission Study and thanks to you as you prayed for and participated in that process. Their hard work and your prayers and input made it all happen. Soon, all that work will be in the hands of the newly elected PNC. I hope you're already in prayer for that committee as you have been for whoever the next installed pastor will be and for this congregation as it continues faithfully serving in the here and now.

There are exciting and amazing things going on that need your gifts for ministry, your prayers, and your participation as we remain focused on playing our part in the building of God's kingdom in this place and in our world. And that's the view from where I sit.....

SESSION NOTES

At its stated meeting on Sunday, September 18, 2022, Session discussed the formation of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) that will conduct the search for a new pastor. The nominating committee will present their recommendations for members of the PNC at a congregational meeting that will be held on October 16. The worship committee reported that Kirkin' of the Tartans will be held on October 30. The Christian education committee reported that the Wednesday after-school program has been suspended temporarily; the committee is seeking volunteers for the program. The stewardship committee reported that pledge letters and cards will be mailed to the congregation in October, and Consecration Sunday will be on November 6. The property committee reported that the plaster work in the sanctuary is in progress; no disruptions in worship are expected. The mission committee reported that on June 30 and December 31 of each year, any money in the Faith on the Fifth Fund not due to a special offering will be donated to SCCM for use in assistance with cooling or heating. The nominating committee will present recommendations for new officers at a congregational meeting on September 25. The Mission Study Team reported that the Mission Study is complete.

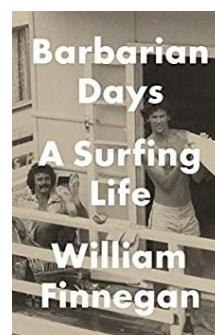

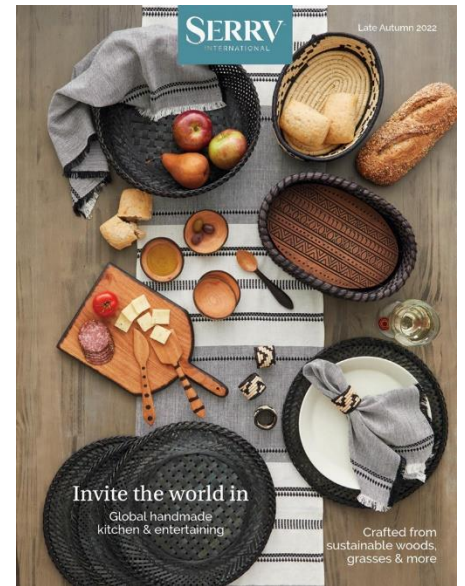

SCCM's CARING and SHARING CAMPAIGN



It is time for SCCM's 2022 Caring and Sharing campaign! This campaign began in 2010 and has tremendously impacted our available funds to help our neighbors Who would think that loose change and bills dropped into a little yellow cup could make such a difference? All of us working together makes the Caring and Sharing campaign so successful. In 2021 our Community Tables in Albemarle, Norwood, and Richfield served 48,537 meals. Our Food Pantry distributed 723,641 pounds of food to clients, and the Assistance Center provided \$217,505 in utility, rent and medicine assistance. This year, our campaign will kick off on **Sunday, September 25. Yellow cups are in the Pit Stop.**

Proceeds from this collection will be used to purchase food and supplies for the Community Tables and Food Pantry and will provide assistance with client needs.

We appreciated your help so we can continue to provide services to people in need in our community in the future.

Stewardship Moment
“For Such a Time As This”

In the September 2022 church newsletter, Rev. George shared the story of Queen Esther (Est 4:14c) who risked her power and authority AND her life by speaking out and intervening on behalf of the Jewish people. She saved their lives by choosing to make a difference. Her Uncle Mordecai encouraged her to action by saying, “Who knows? Perhaps you have come to royal dignity for just a time as this.”

I don’t have to tell you that people in Albemarle and surrounding area could use our intervention and help to make a difference in their lives. These are challenging times, and many are in need. Since September 11 (and continuing until October 25), our church leaders, during the Offertory, have shared individual stories of actions our Church has taken to conduct a summer youth camp program and to support Stanly Christian Community Ministry and Homes of Hope. Through October, you will hear additional stories that include how we serve each other, youth, the elderly, those in need, and the Lord.

Throughout the year, we translate your pledges and offerings into making a difference... in both direct and indirect activities and donations. Sunday, November 6 is Consecration Sunday and presents an opportunity for each of us to think about how we can make a difference. During the Sunday service, we will dedicate our gifts for 2023. Like Uncle Mordecai, we encourage you to prayerfully consider your response to “such a time as this.”

Also, please note in this newsletter, the Stewardship committee has provided a primer on how to complete a pledge card. Pledge cards will be distributed the week of October 16, along with information about church’s activities and finances and making a request to pledge.

To properly fill out your pledge card

First decide on your total yearly commitment.

Write that amount as your 2023 yearly pledge (\$4,000).

**Next, decide if you will give weekly, quarterly, monthly or as a single gift to meet the pledge.
(Monthly would be \$333.33, Quarterly would be \$1,000, Weekly – 53 Sundays in 2023, would be \$75.47)**

Most importantly, don’t forget to sign your pledge card.

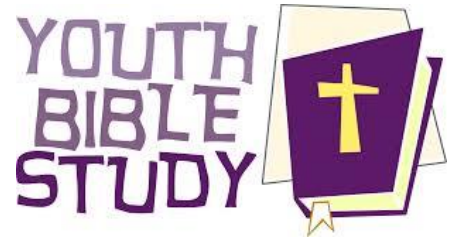
