
Pentecost Sunday, June 9

NEWS & NOTES

SESSION NOTES

At its stated meeting on May 19, 2019, Session heard reports from Christian Education, Personnel, Stewardship, Property, Mission and Nominating committees. The Christian Education committee reported that Palm Sunday Marketplace was very successful, and Youth Club had another successful year that concluded in late April. Teachers and leaders were recognized during worship on May 19. On June 2, Rev. David Sutton will preach and there will be a recognition of members who have reached fifty years of membership; brunch will follow the service. Volunteers are still needed for Music and Arts Camp. The Personnel committee reported that staff reviews were completed on May 8. It was also announced that Stan Scheer will be on leave during July and August. Session approved a recommendation from the Stewardship committee that the co-pastor model begin on September 1 to coordinate with Rally Day. The Property committee reported that roof repairs have been completed and the gym ceiling has been repainted. The committee also reported that an acoustical engineer will be submitting plans for acoustical panels that can be built and installed in the gym by church volunteers. The Property committee recommended that the church sign a one-year contract with Garmon for HVAC repairs and maintenance. The Mission committee reported that an Opioid Lunch and Learn was scheduled for May 21. The committee also reported that the annual Central School staff brunch is scheduled for June 7 at First Presbyterian at 9:30 a.m. First Presbyterian continues to support missions in Mwandia and will be sponsoring nine students there. A fundraiser for the mission trip to Honduras this summer will be held on June 23. The backpack program will conclude for the school year after backpacks are filled on May 29. The Nominating committee has met and will solicit nominations for Diaconate and Session for terms beginning in 2020. The committee will meet again on June 23 to begin reviewing nominations. Information requesting nominations from the congregation will appear in the church bulletin for several weeks.

Ministers' report: Worship services will start at 10 a.m. beginning on June 2 when Rev. David Sutton will preach. On June 23, Anna Wainwright will speak in worship about her trips to Cuba and Africa with Presbyterian Campus Ministries. Matt Drumheller's sabbatical began following worship on May 19. He will return on August 19. On Maundy Thursday, April 18, Elizabeth and Matt along with elders Gayle Russell and Jim Sawyer, served communion to homebound members. The next stated Session meeting is scheduled for Sunday, June 16, 2019, at 8:30 a.m.


BUMBLE BEE BALLS




