Dear Friends.

The Advent season, which we began at the end of November, is a season focused on waiting. In a year dominated by pandemic, we will not have to strain to explore the idea of waiting. In Advent, we anticipate the birth of Christ as the fulfillment of God's dreams for humanity. We are like those who dream when we expectantly wait for a world redeemed by the birth of Christ.

This Advent, may we find hope in the practice of waiting. May we be like those who dream.

ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS WORSHIP SEASON

First Sunday of Advent

Like everything else this year, Advent is going to look different. Our celebration of Advent this year will be inspired by and supported by *A Sanctified Art*. This is a company that creates artistic worship and devotional materials. As we begin an important season in the life of the church, there are several ways for you to get involved.

Advent for All Drive-Thru Event...Our *Advent for All* event this year will look very different since we are unable to gather. When you drive through after worship for your Cookies & Cocoa and Advent Devotional on the first Sunday of Advent on November 29, we will provide you with material to make an advent wreath at home, along with the devotions for each week in Advent. We hope you will make time to craft your wreath and gather for the devotions with your family every week.

Hanging of the Greenery...We will be unable to decorate the sanctuary and the church as we normally would this year, however we would love to have your help decorating the Chrismon Tree. In the week following the First Sunday of Advent, you are invited to sign- up to come hang some Chrismons. On Tuesday, December 1 and Thursday, December 3, 15 minute time slots will be available from 5:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Please call the church office to sign-up to come into the sanctuary help decorate (wearing a mask and practicing social distancing). In this way, you can help create our Advent worship space.

Fellowship Drive-Thru...After worship each Sunday (whether online or in person) you are invited to hop in your car and come drive thru the parking lot. You'll receive sweet treats and a chance to see some familiar faces. Also, you will have the opportunity to participate in our Alternative Gifts program, our Christmas Kitchen, and more.

Advent Music...Are you missing the chance to be in the sanctuary this Advent to hear the music of the season? We have just the Pop-Up event for you! For one week during Advent, there will be several days in which you can come to the sanctuary and listen to our wonderful organist, Stan Scheer, play through the music of the season. You can sign up for a 30-minute time slot to sit in the sanctuary and hear the music. We will be following social distancing guidelines, mask guidelines, and the indoor gathering restrictions put in place by the governor. This means that space will be limited at each of our sessions. 

News from Mabumba

During the years of 2018 and 2019, the central and southern areas of Africa suffered from a severe drought. Our friends in Mwandi fared much better than other more isolated villages in Zambia and neighboring

countries. Mwandi is located on the Zambezi River, the third largest river in Zambia. Although the river was extremely low, the people surrounding the river had access to water. This was not true for others

The water tables fell so low at the village of Mabumba that the First Presbyterian sponsored well pulled sediment into the pump. At the time the school headmaster contacted us, the pump was operating at approximately one-third capacity. The pump has now been repaired using funds from the original fundraising effort, and a regular maintenance schedule is being implemented. Headmaster Mutipan Mutafela has reported that the pump is fully functional and providing water for the students at the Mabumba School.



Morning Prayer


Mondays and Wednesdays at 10:00 a.m. on Zoom


