Over the last several weeks, the Stewardship Committee invited you to think about how you are called to help fund our Church by making an annual pledge. As we shared with you in previous communications, we are made stronger by the fact that we are disciples of Christ **TOGETHER**, supporting and loving each other, and striving to live God's word. This is what discipleship is about.

In a recent letter, Reverend George shared with us that stewardship is giving a portion of one's income in thanksgiving for all that God has given us.
