First Presbyterian Church Art Gallery Open Now (Located in the Church Basement) GHA Autism Supports Creative Arts Program Presents POP ART

Do you like looking at bold images of everyday items painted in bright colors? This type of art is called *Pop Art*, and it began in the 1950s. Pop Art is a style of art based on simple, bold images of everyday items, such as soup cans, painted in bright colors.

The term *pop art* originated with Lawrence Alloway, a British museum supervisor. He used the term to describe the new form of popular art that had a modern feel and the phrase stuck. Many famous artists who participated in this artistic movement became household names.

This year, the GHA Creative Arts students are exploring this artistic medium by using simple images and adding bright bold colors in a comic book style. Our courageous students have expressed themselves through their artworks more than words can express.

Other Adult Sunday School class offerings (meet at 9:45 a.m. at the church):

Hard Sayings of Jesus led by Dr. Bill Jolly (Location: Old Session Room-Basement)

Like his original hearers, many people today find Jesus' sayings hard. Some sayings are hard because they are difficult to understand, others because the demands they make on us are only too clear. F. F. Bruce examines seventy of the hard sayings of Jesus to clear away the cultural and historical difficulties which keep us from grappling with the real challenge of Jesus' message. Evident in each chapter is Bruce's keen evangelical scholarship and pastoral insight. Participants will look at a different hard saying each week and discuss. One example of a hard saying of Jesus is, *But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you*.

The Wired Word led by various facilitators (Location: Church Parlor)

The class meets each week and discusses current events and Bible verses that relate to that event. Every Thursday morning, an email is sent to class members from *The Wired Word* organization (a non-denominational group) that contains three key elements: 1) a two-page summary of a specific current event or news item, 2) a few *key questions* to stimulate your thinking about the article and 3) several Bible verses which relate directly to issues in the news article or the key questions. You can read the lesson at your convenience and spend as much (or little) time thinking about it. In class on Sunday, the facilitator will briefly review highlights of the news article and lead the discussion of the key questions and Bible verses. Because the lesson is different every week, it does not matter if you miss a week or more at a time for whatever the reason. Please come and give it a try!
