



Stewardship Moment “For Such a Time as This”

November 6 will be consecration Sunday. This year our stewardship theme is “For Such A Time As This.” The verse from Esther reads: “For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father’s family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?”

Mordecai was urging Esther to act, pointing her to a higher purpose. He was asking her to use her position, even in the face of death, to become God’s instrument of deliverance for the Jews in Persia. She could have done nothing but chooses to step out in faith, put her own interests aside, and accomplish God’s work. We can think of Stewardship as a call to a higher purpose. The treasure, time and talent we give helps to make our community a better place by enabling our Church to help others, to do the work that Christ not only wants but expects us to do.

Last Sunday, Jim Hesley, Deacon, shared with you how, because of the generosity of our congregation, we’ve made an impact on the **lives of children**. “Earlier this summer, in a collaborative effort with First Baptist and First Lutheran Churches, seventy-five children attended “Amazingly Created” camp in this building. Fourteen were from families with no definite congregation or church home. The theme of the camp was “How God Made the World...and Us!” The building was alive all week with happy noise as children went to their daily stations: Art and Bible projects, Nature, Music, Recreation, and a particularly enjoyable session, “Preparing Healthy Snacks.” They were entertained by a parrot that did tricks! On Thursday, the children in their art session made cards to be mailed to shut-ins in each of the three sponsoring Churches.

Over twenty-five volunteers tithed their time to staff and lead the camp for five hours all five days that week. Our creative Melissa Eudy, Christian Education Director, heard later in general adult conversation during the following week that the camp was “the talk of the town!” This is First Presbyterian Church at its best in the lives of children and adults! Because of your giving, our congregation worships together in a place of radical hospitality. The creativity and energy in this place brings welcome, relationship, and community to all who enter its doors! This is a place that touches and changes lives! Your faithful and generous giving has a direct impact on the mission and ministry of our Church! Thank you!”

Yes, stewardship asks you to give your time, talent, and treasure but those gifts paint a picture of God’s love to those that we should serve.... children and youth, those that hunger, the homeless, our seniors, each other and the Lord.

You will find baskets with marbles in them around the church (entrances to the sanctuary, the pit stop, outside of the office). These marbles remind us of the times we serve God in mission. Please take a marble if you don’t have one or another for someone else and let it serve to remind you of the call to respond to God’s Word and the way that Christ lived. Keep and carry that marble with you....in your pocket or in your purse.... anywhere to remind you that our stewardship call is a response to “such a time as this.”
