

"Painting the Picture of Stewardship"

Serving those in need

On Sunday, October 16, Emily Andrew, Deacon painted the picture of some of the ways our Church helps those in need. She said:

"Our church makes a critical impact on this community by serving those in need. Our faithful and continuing financial generosity as a congregation defines areas of specific need and encourages our members to participate in lessening the burdens of others. Our church financially supports many of the agencies tasked with providing organized, formal assistance outreach. Our members participate as volunteers at all levels in many of these agencies and in two also serve in major leadership roles: the Crisis Assistance Ministry and the Backpack program at Central Elementary School.


Crisis Assistance Ministry is an organization that helps people bridge short term emergency financial needs. Because of job loss, family medical needs, or some other interruption, these neighbors are behind in their utility bills, rent, or mortgage payments. Often families face eviction or having the power shut off in their homes. Crisis Assistance Ministry, sponsored by the Stanly County Ministerial Association, is of critical importance in providing a practical lifeline for people as they try to get through an immediate crisis.

Likewise, the Backpack program is a major source of assurance for students on weekends when there is no access to school breakfasts or lunches. Our church has supported this major act of caring for many years. At the present time, twenty large backpacks are made up monthly for food insecure families who live right here in Albemarle! They are carefully packed with nourishing, easy to prepare food items. And, if there are several children in the pre- assigned homes, our quiet, efficient church members always pack so that there is enough for each child!

Yes, this is First Presbyterian Church at its best as it energetically contributes to the well-being of our neighbors! Because of your faithful giving, our congregation joins the church universal in changing lives!!
